

JUNIOR BEACH VOLLEYBALL – ASIAN CHAMPIONSHIP AND WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP SELECTION POLICY 2017 and 2018

Preamble

- A. This Selection Policy applies to Men’s and Women’s Beach Volleyball National Teams for 2017 and 2018. It will apply to the following selection decisions
1. Selection of teams/athletes to compete in the 2017 Asian Beach Volleyball Championships (U21 [athletes born on or after January 1st, 1997-December 31st, 1999]) and the 2018 Asian Beach Volleyball Championships (U19 [athletes born on or after January 1st, 2000-December 31st, 2001])
 2. Selection of teams/athletes to compete in the 2017 FIVB Beach Volleyball Under 21 World Championships [athletes born on or after January 1st, 1997-December 31st, 1999] and the 2019 FIVB Beach Volleyball Under 19 World Championships [athletes born on or after January 1st, 2000-December 31st, 2001].
- B. The Policy will be applied by the VA Selection Committee, which will make recommendations to the VA board for ratification. A separate Selection Committee will be appointed for each gender consisting of:
- High Performance Director (Chair)
 - Pathways Director
 - Head Coach/Technical Director of Beach Volleyball
 - Senior Coach, VA Beach Volleyball of the relevant gender
 - The appointed Head Coach of the relevant team of the relevant gender
 - One or two other person(s) with international Beach Volleyball experience, but unconnected to the teams/athletes standing for selection.

If a member of the Selection Committee has a direct coaching relationship or other close connection with a team or athlete being considered for selection, that person will disclose that relationship and may or may not take part in the selection decision concerning that team, at the Chair’s discretion.

- C. The criteria listed below will be applied in each selection decision. However, the weight given to each criterion will be totally at the discretion of the Selection Committee, and the weight may vary dependent on the selection decision being considered, and the timing of that decision.
- D. The dates for the making of the various selection decisions are listed below as indicative and these may change at the recommendation of the Selection Committee.

- E. The Selection Committee may propose any amendments to this Policy to the VA Board at any time. Such amendments are only valid when adopted by the VA Board.

Selection Criteria

In making the selection decisions referred to in A above the Selection Committee will take into account the following Selection Criteria

- VA and FIVB eligibility criteria.
- Relevant FIVB Rankings at the time of making the Selection Decision.
- AVC Beach Volleyball Rankings and Australian Beach Volleyball Rankings.
- Individual and team international results in 2015, 2016 2017 and 2018
- Individual and team domestic tour results in 2015, 2016,2017 and 2018
- Individual and team results in the 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 Australian Junior Beach Volleyball Championships (AJBVC)
- Individual performances in Junior Beach Volleyball Program camps held in 2016, 2017 and 2018.
- The perceived ability of the team/athletes to achieve the best results in the event concerned in the Selection Decision.
- The perceived potential for development as individuals for the 2020 or 2024 Olympic Teams and the 2022 Commonwealth Games Team as well as the relevant Commonwealth Youth Games and Olympic Youth Games teams.
- The team's/athlete's commitment to following the National direction as specified by the Head Coach/Technical Director, High Performance Director, Pathways Director and Senior Coaches.
- The team's/athlete's availability to compete in and prepare for the Asian Championships and/or World Championships for their targeted age group.
- Attendance at national camps as notified by the Head Coach/Technical Director and the Pathways Coach.
- AWE categorisation of the players.

Selection Timelines

The following are indicative dates for the Selection Decisions mentioned above. They may change as circumstances, entry closing dates and calendars change.

Asian U21 Beach Volleyball Championships	On or before January 31 st 2017
Asian U19 Beach Volleyball Championships	TBD 2018
U21 FIVB Beach Volleyball Age Group World Championships 2017	On or before May 31 st 2017
U19 FIVB Beach Volleyball Age Group World Championships 2018	TBD 2018

VA Eligibility Criteria



In order to be chosen by VA as a member of a National Beach Volleyball team to compete in International events (including International events held in Australia) each athlete must:

- a) have a current and valid Australian Passport;
- b) not have represented another country in any sport for the preceding two years;
- c) be, or be eligible to immediately become, a registered and financial member of a State or Territory volleyball governing body that is a Member of VA (as the term "Member" is defined in the Constitution); and
- d) be compliant with all applicable anti-doping policies, including those of FIVB and VA; and
- e) be free of any injury or illness which will or has the potential to impair, inhibit or prevent the athlete from performing at the requisite level; and
- f) be compliant with any eligibility guidelines published from time to time by the FIVB or the AVC, including rules and guidelines which apply to eligibility to represent Australia in the sport of Beach Volleyball.

Appeals

The sole grounds upon which an athlete may appeal his or her non-selection in a Team or for an event are:

1. The Selection Policy has not been properly followed or implemented.
2. The athlete was prevented from having a reasonable opportunity to meet the Selection Criteria.
3. There was no material on which the decision of the athlete's non-selection could reasonably be based.

Any appeal from an athlete against his or non-selection by VA will be resolved according to the following procedure:

- a) The appeal will be heard by the VA Appeal Tribunal (**Tribunal**).
- b) The appellant must be the athlete who has not been selected.
- c) The appellant must give written notice, including grounds of his or her appeal to VA's CEO within 48 hours of the being informed of the Selection Committee's decision.
- d) The Tribunal will comprise the following persons, as appointed by the VA Board:
 - A barrister or solicitor who will act as Chair;
 - A person with a thorough knowledge of the sport and who preferably has had recent international competition experience in the sport; and
 - one other person of experience and skills suitable to the function of the Tribunal.
- e) No person is eligible to be appointed to the Tribunal if he or she is a member of the VA Board or the Selection Committee, or if by reason of his or her relationship with the appellant or any member of the Board or Selection Committee he or she would be reasonably considered to be other than impartial.
- f) The Tribunal will convene a hearing as soon as possible after the submission of the grounds of appeal. The Tribunal is not bound by the rules of evidence but must observe the principles of natural justice and procedural fairness.



- g) Prior to the hearing, the Selection Committee will provide the Tribunal and the appellant with a written statement as to the reasons for the decision against which the appeal is made.
- h) The Tribunal will give its decision as soon as practicable after the hearing and may provide the VA CEO and the appellant with a statement of the reasons for its decision.
- i) The VA CEO or the Chair of the Tribunal may impose any other procedure for the appeal which, in either's belief, is fair and appropriate in the circumstances.

The decision of the Tribunal will be final and binding on the parties and it is agreed that neither party will institute or maintain proceedings in any court or tribunal other than the Tribunal. Failure to observe the above time limits will render any appeal a nullity provided that an athlete may apply to the VA CEO for an extension of time in which to commence an appeal. The VA CEO has discretion whether to grant an extension of time, although shall only do so in circumstances where the delay is caused by extenuating circumstances outside the control of the athlete concerned.
